Miss Kuriger taught us about rationing. We do not like the sound of this word. I have been guarding my hay.

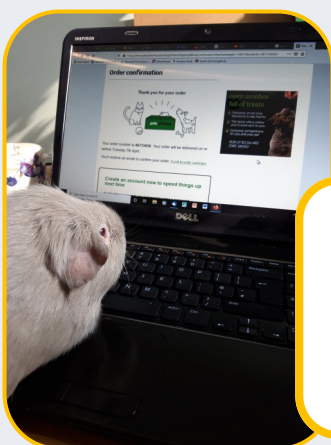
Fine Motor Skills

Jigsaws are a good lesson but it is tempting to eat the pieces.



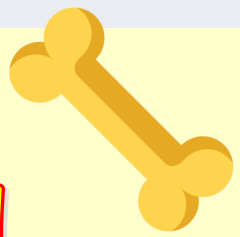
Computing

I learnt how to order hay online. It worked! The postman brought me my parcel today. Magic!

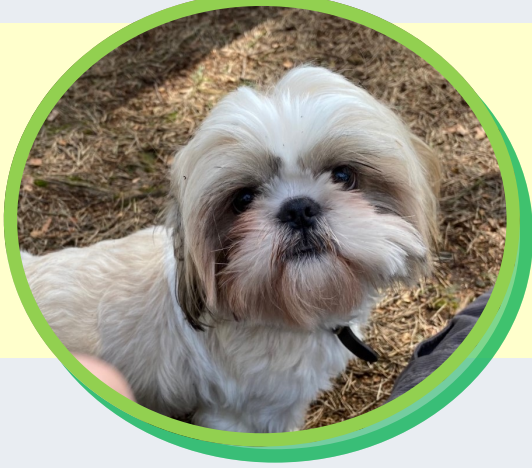
