CIRCLE TIME

Every day, indoors, the children will take part in several circle time sessions. Our focus during these sessions are:

Speaking and Listening

Good listening is:

- *Looking at the person who is talking
- *Listening to ALL the words
- *Staying quiet
- *Sitting still

Mathematics

- * Develop basic counting strategies e.g. subitising, recognising arrangements, count using 1:1 correspondence
- * Apply these through rhymes, songs, stories and solve real world problems
- * Explore and talk about shape and pattern
- * Understand positional language and use to discuss, describe familiar routes and locations

Communication and Language

- *Listen to and explore stories
- *Little Wandle Foundation Phonics

Write Dance and Dough Disco

*Develop gross and fine motor control through music, movement and mark making sessions

QUIET TIME

Our Quiet Time runs from 12.30pm until 1.30pm. After a busy morning outside and a hot lunch, the children are ready for it. The children all have their own sleeping mat and blanket. All children will lie down from 12.30pm-1.00pm and listen to a story CD or calming music. Some will drop off to sleep, whereas others will just spend the time listening and relaxing. Please send in a toy or comforter for this time in their bags to make this special for them. There is a distinct difference in the afternoon with regards their listening and attention when children have had this "time out".

We are always happy to chat with any questions you have about your little one in Nursery. This is best done at pick up rather than drop off time. Mornings can be busy with lots of children to get in and settled and so a quick morning message is ideal here. For those children who attend After School Club regularly, email will be the ideal form of communication.
