NEWSLETTER for Blackwell First School- Yellow Class



Welcome back

I hope that you all had a well-deserved break over Easter and were able to enjoy some of the lovely sunshine! We are heading in to the last term of being together in Yellow Class and Mrs Marks, Mrs Flynn, Mrs Dudek and I are excited to start the summer term. Our new topic is 'Globe Trotters' which will see us learning about 3 different places, South Africa, Amsterdam and Birmingham to see the similarities and differences. We will be having a special coronation celebration at the end of this topic to so we are excited to invite everyone into school.

TOPIC

We are going to start this half term with a topic called 'Globe Trotters'. Geography and R.E. are the areas of the curriculum taught during this topic.



In Geography, the children will focus their learning on the city of Amsterdam. We will be discovering where Amsterdam is located and comparing the human and physical features that it has to that of Birmingham. They will then be asked to think about the question

"What is it like to live in Amsterdam compared with Birmingham?"

R.E. will focus on the religions and celebrations that we have learnt about so far this year and making a connection to our own beliefs about the world.

PSHE, Music, Computing, French, P.E and Philosophy for Children are taught each week throughout the year. See our 'Curriculum' page on the school website for more information.

BITS AND PIECES

Please check that your child has the following in school with them every day:

- school book bag
- home reading card and folder so the children can change their books.
- water bottle and snack/tuck money
- hooded, waterproof coat
- P.E kit (to include jogging bottoms, shorts, <u>trainers and pumps</u>, white t-shirt, jumper, hair bobble for children with shoulder length hair or longer and a plastic carrier bag for muddy trainers)
- wellingtons and a pair of thick socks

Forest School for children in Yellow Class will take place on different days this term. Check on parent app if you are not sure of your child's days.

The children can come to school wearing jogging bottoms on this day.

<u>Please read with your child daily to help build fluency, develop</u> word meaning and check their inference skills.

LITERACY

As a class, we will read 'Africa, Amazing Africa' by Atinuke, a non-fiction text. The children will first develop their understanding through questioning, predicting and summarising. They will then write a letter and create an advert for an African country.

We will be focusing on literary features such conjunctions, prepositions and paragraphs. Handwriting sessions will focus on specific joined letter formation and capital letter formation.

In spelling, the children will be taught a range of spelling conventions including adding suffixes —less, -ness, -ly, -ful, -ed, -ing, -s and —es. We will also practise reading and spelling the following tricky words:

occasion, occasionally, possess, possession, purpose, quarter, question, recent, regular, reign, remember, separate, strange, strength, suppose, surprise, therefore, though, although, through, various.

The game 'Little Bird Spelling' on <u>www.ictgames.com</u> is very useful and the children enjoy playing this.

NUMERACY

During Numeracy, children will be completing a range of activities to help develop their understanding of time. Time can be a very tricky subject so any help at home would be much appreciated. The children will then be learning about division through initially learning mental methods before progressing onto written methods with larger numbers.

The children will also continue developing their problem solving skills through daily word problems and bar modelling. We will also have opportunities for the children to reason with their learning too.

Mental starters will focus on counting in 11s, 11 times table, doubles of number with the 1s digits 5 or less, mental addition and subtraction and multiplying and dividing by 4 and 8.

Daily times table practice at home significantly helps too! Squeebles and hit the button are great apps to use.
