Give reasons for your ideas. 	<p>Practise these mental maths facts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Counting forward and back in 3s Quickly recalling all multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables out of order Doubles and halves to 20
<p><u>Perform a poem. Look at the Cinderella poem on the back of this sheet and learn how to perform it.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read with rhythm. Use expression where needed for effect. Include actions/sound effects if you want to. Practise and perform. 	<p>Listen to Bibbidi-Bobbidi-Boo (1948) written by Al Hoffman, Mack David and Jerry Livingston (link below). Music from the Cinderella film.</p> <p>There are a number of different rhythms that make up this section. Have a look at the music on the back of this sheet and try some of the rhythms yourself. (The three notes together with a 3 on top, count as one beat).</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> With an adult choose your own 'instruments' Keep a steady pulse Try one of the other rhythms 	<p>Research the famous film maker, Walt Disney (some links below).</p> <p>Create a timeline of his life.</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find out significant events – birth, death etc. Label dates clearly. Space events well on your timeline. 	<p><u>Create your own miniature animation using a flipbook (see link below).</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Draw picture on the last page first. Draw next in a slightly different page. Continue and animate!
<p>Spellings. In this half term we will revisit all the spellings for year 1 and 2 that need more practise (see termly grid previously given out or ask for another if needed).</p> <p>Practise them by playing hangman with a friend or grown up.</p>	<p><u>Choose a section from Ella's Big Chance and create a piece of artwork based upon it.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose an artistic style (e.g. abstract). Choose your media (paint, pencils, pastels, paper). Choose a technique such as collage, painting, printing... Create foreground and background. 	<p>There are now lots of different Disneyworlds/lands – California (USA), Florida (USA), Tokyo (Japan), Paris (France), Hong Kong (China), Shanghai (China).
