TOPIC

ENGLISH

We are going to be exploring our literacy learning using the story 'Katie Morag Delivers the Mail' by Mairi Hedderick. The children will work towards writing a letter to Katie Morag explaining what it is like to live in Blackwell.

Spelling, handwriting and discrete reading sessions will continue.

MATHS

In mental maths we will continue to work on our fluency when counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s as well as doubles and halves to 20 + 20 and instant recall of number bonds to 20. We will also begin to learn the 2 times table. Please see the mental maths sheet that I shared with you during Parent Meetings.

This half term we will continue to develop our understanding of a variety of written and mental strategies for addition.

Spending time securing children's understanding of smaller numbers is crucial for the development of calculation skills later on in the year.
