Dear Families,

The children have enjoyed a positive half term and their 'Let's Perform' topic has enabled them to share their learning with the whole school in a performance morning. As part of their 'Beliefs' work, several classes have visited places of worship, learning about respect and tolerance. These meaningful opportunities help the children to broaden and deepen their learning.

Special thanks to everyone on the PFTA and those supporting events who are enabling us to purchase resources at this very challenging time for school budgets. Thanks to Mrs Hampton for her family Yoga! I am sure you can imagine that staff cover costs and energy costs have risen significantly, without any further government funding. Our school budget has been taken up entirely with running and staffing costs, meaning we rely heavily on fundraising from the PFTA and are grateful to them for their excellent work. The PFTA is funding 10 ipads and waterproof jackets for Forest School. The PFTA has also kindly agreed to fully fund the considerable cost of bell boating for the Year 4 children, during a year when Year 4 families already fund the children's residential trip. This is a significant cost and all children will benefit from this as they move into Year 4.

Thank you for returning parent questionnaires. We always send them out at this point in the year as it provides feedback for us for the rest of the year rather than being an end of year feedback which is easily forgotten. Thank you for your ongoing positive comments and support. We will address any queries.

I have enjoyed visiting each class over the last week to formally monitor the children's learning and am delighted to see how well the children are learning across the school.

We recruited three new members of staff last week: Mrs McDermott who starts after half term working with individual children, Mrs Brown who will work in Nursery once we admit our two year olds after Easter and Mrs Pemberton who will join us in September. Congratulations to them all and welcome to the team.

Finally, please do get in touch with either myself via email or the classteachers after school if you would like to ask any questions about your child's learning or any other aspect of school life. We are always here to help. Parent Consultation meetings will take place next half term and teachers will share some 'home friendly' targets and we would be grateful for your help with these, as extra practise will help the children to make more progress.

Parent Consultations - keeping you informed

Now that we are in the second term of the year, we can reflect on the children's progress so far this year. It is time for Parent Consultation meetings soon and letters have been sent home for you to book appointments. These times are opportunities to consider the children's progress so far this year, share information regarding their social and emotional development and any other relevant information that the teachers and families find useful to share. If you have specific issues that will require further discussion, the classteachers may advise you to book a separate appointment so that they do not keep other parents waiting unnecessarily. These appointments will take place on site, unless you specifically book a zoom appointment, in order for you to view your child's workbooks.

As a school we aim to keep you informed about how to *support*your child and also about their progress through:

- School newsletters that keep you up to date with school events as well as educational news;
- Class newsletters and homework sheets that share the learning in each class so that you are aware of learning in all curriculum areas each half term;
- Early Years workshops;
- Reports (1 short and 1 longer), that provide information on your child's progress in line with the assessments teachers complete in school;
- Information meetings prior to moving year group;
- Website with all learning for each year group and
- Termly parent consultations.
