IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR RECEPTION?

For our school September starters.....

Take care of own belongings to/from school and be able to separate from parent/carer.

Be able to look at the person talking and listen by staying quiet and sitting still.

Use the toilet independently and wash and dry hands afterwards.

Be able to dress and undress independently, including coats and shoes.

Be able to interact with peers, taking turns and sharing.

Be confident to talk to familiar adults and ask for help when needed.

Respond to rules and boundaries, understanding their importance.

Be able to recognise their own name.

Clap and count syllables in words.

Hear and say some initial sounds in words.

Be able to hold a book accurately, enjoy/talk about stories and hear rhyming words.

Subitise numbers up to 3, count forwards and backwards to 10 and recognise familiar number patterns e.g. dice, in a row

Be able to use scissors, cut and eat food using a knife and fork and hold a pencil accurately using a tripod grip.
