READING

Reading books are changed every Friday.

they have read in school that week and an
additional book containing the taught sounds. Library books are
books which can be read to the children and are books which are
read for pleasure. These can be changed as often as the children
like. Reading with children is the biggest way to impact your
child's progress. I enjoyed sharing our vision for reading at our

BITS AND PIECES

FOREST SCHOOL

Forest School takes places every Wednesday. Now the weather is growing colder, please pack a named warm hat, gloves and a pair of thick socks for Forest School. You might want children to wear an extra layer to keep them nice and warm on particularly chilly days.

This is what we will learn across the curriculum.

Communication and Language/Literacy

- *Take turns to speak and listen.
- *Speak in full sentences.
- *Listen to and explore vocabulary from 'We are a tribe of kids'.
- *Learn new phoneme/grapheme correspondences e.g. j, v, w, x and y.
- *Continue to blend and segment CVC words i.e. jam, wet.
- *Read phrases and simple sentences.

Mathematics

- *Continue to develop basic counting skills.
- * Continue to develop number sense by using concrete apparatus.
- *Use concrete apparatus to add and subtract and develop associated vocabulary.
- *Use bar modelling to support problem solving.

Physical Development

- *Copy, create and refine motifs in dance.
- *Develop fine motor control through our music, movement and mark making sessions (Write Dance and Dough Dance).
- *Develop an efficient tripod grip and write first names using cursive script.
- *Wake and Shake- Don't stop moving, S Club 7

Topic

- * Keep the beat and tap a simple rhythm.
- *Continue to use hand shapes to match pitch through our Kodaly approach.
- * Learn what colours can be made by mixing different coloured paints.
- * Learn about the artists Joan Miro and Alice Rahon
- *Name and draw parts of human and animal bodies
