| <p>In English we are reading 'The Quangle Wangle's Hat' by Edward Lear.</p> <p><u>Listen to/read the poem again and practise reciting it. Perhaps a grown up could film you and send it in to office@blackwell.worcs.sch.uk for us to see.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read/listen to the Quangle Wangle's Hat again Recite with expression Film and evaluate your performance | <p>In PE we are learning a dance to perform at a dance festival in a few weeks. <u>Have a go at creating your own dance to a song of your choice.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose a song Create motifs Consider movements at different levels (high/low) Perform with the music Film it (if you can) | <p>In History we have been learning about the Suffragettes. <u>Create your own "Votes for Women" campaign poster.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use knowledge from learning at school about the Suffragettes Use words Use illustrations Think carefully about colour choices (purple, green and white were the colours of the Suffragettes) | <p>Practise the 5 times tables. You could use hit the button to do this.</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p> <p>Once you are able to do this, try to find the corresponding division facts.</p> <p>E.g. $5 \times 6 = 30$ so $30 \div 5 = 6$</p> |
