

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- *Name changes in our lives and how to cope with them.
- *Prepare for Year 1.

Communication and Language/Literacy

- *Continue to read words ending with -s, -es, -ed and -ing in Phonics and revisit all tricky words.
- *Share and explore' Whatever next', 'The train ride' and 'Errol's Garden'.
- *Read and write facts.
- *Create a poem about travelling.

Mathematics

- *Count in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- * Continue to develop our understanding of the composition of numbers. (How they can be made)
- *Revisit addition and subtraction.
- *Copy, repeat and create patterns.

Physical Development

- *Learn some simple team games to develop throwing and catching skills.
- * Learn skills for a country dance e.g. promenade.
- *Continue to develop accurate cursive letter formation and reduce letter size.

Wake and Shake -children's choice to promote the British Value of democracy.

<u>Understanding the World (History)</u>

- *Ask historical questions
- *Use historical sources
- *Find out about changes in transport
- *Create simple timelines

Expressive Arts and Design

- *Pinch, pull, roll and twist clay.
- *Add patterns and texture to clay.
