Thanks also to the PFTA for amazing fundraising efforts during this difficult year, so essential to ensure that we can continue to offer the rich and varied educational opportunities currently available whilst the budgetary demands are increasingly challenging. I say it each year, but without the PFTA funds the school would not offer what it does. During this term alone, they have part funded the trip to Blist's Hill, paid for bellboating for Year 4s and their end of year dictionaries. Particular mention must be made to our Year 4s and their families for their support to the school over the years. You were our COVID Red Class and look how far you have come!

Our results show that the children have again made strong progress, which has been supported by excellent teaching. When the children leave us in Year 4, they have developed into individuals who are mostly working securely with many children at above expected standards and with life skills of independence, communication and an excellent sense of moral purpose. This group has been a joyful class of polite and hard working children and it has been rewarding to watch them develop over the years and the progress that they have made from Red Class to Blue Class has been superb.

The school works hard to fulfil its role as a real community school and remains at the heart of the village. The work we do supports children in developing that sense of community and their own role within a community and as part of the UK. Developing the children as local and global citizens is an important aspect of our work as could be seen during our Collective worship themes on values. Our community work this year on 'Tea and Toast', work with the residents of Burcot Grange and the Summer Fair have all served to unite us. Finally, I would like to say, on behalf of everyone at school, thank you for your support and your kind words throughout the year. Good luck to adults and children who are moving on to new schools and new adventures. We wish you well and hope that you come back to see us. Have a good summer break and we will all meet again on 4<sup>th</sup> September when we welcome our new Nursery and Reception intakes and new staff members.

Following our Ofsted Inspection in December 2023, we were pleased with many aspects of the report. We have consulted with families about the curriculum and thank you for your helpful and supportive feedback. In order to ensure that we continue to offer high quality education, we commission external validation which forms an integral part of the selfevaluation of the school.

This year, we have been inspected by Worcestershire Children First and an external consultant. Both of these experiences have been very positive and some comments from the reports provide a flavour of the comments in the reports.

There is a culture of exceptionally high expectations across the school. There is a very strong vision for learning based on the development of the whole child; this was clearly evident in all parts of the review. The highly skilled staff supported by the relentless drive of leaders ensures pupils get the best possible start in life and achieve highly.

Children working at above national expectations are extended through challenges and complexity of task or questioning. Children working below national expectations are clearly supported through scaffolding and adaptation to teaching/learning task

All of this information is used to support the development of next year's School Development Plan.

# **Reports**

This week, you will receive your child's report and there is a covering letter to help you understand how your child is achieving in line with the national standards. It is most important that you look at the children's progress comment as this indicates whether they are working well. Whilst some children do reach this high national standard, it is important that you do not feel that your child is unsuccessful if they are not currently working at the standard. Some children are not, and this is not unexpected as learning has been disrupted during the previous few years and some are still closing the gap. It is also important to remember that children develop at different rates and that many children who may be described as not working at the expectation when they are very young, will go on to reach expectations later on during their primary school years. It is also important to note the general comments and skills development sections as these indicate your child's development in areas that are crucial to their future as learners.

## <u>Summer Holiday 'Keeping up!'</u>

Over the summer, the children need a good rest and break from school. It is important to keep the children reading if you possibly can. Please keep them reading books of their choice and

-Watch stories read by their teachers (on BFS YouTube) and -Spelling and mental maths activities.

The teachers may also send some particular work home for individuals who they feel would benefit from specific work. Please support them with this learning and keep reading!

### **Collective Worship**

During this last week, we have concentrated on 'Changes' to help with transition as well as having 'Freedom' as a theme and we will discuss the freedom that comes from living in the UK and the associated rights that we have. With such rights come responsibilities, and we talk (as part of British Values) about the need to follow the law and what this means. As part of this work, we discuss the lack of freedom for some people across the world and discuss this in terms that the children understand, such as a lack of freedom to go to school, have friends, wear what they want, choose a job and have beliefs that are different from others.

#### **Arts and Sport**

Thank you Mrs Webb for leading sport so well. Miss Bailey will lead on sport whilst Mrs Webb is on maternity leave. Thank you to families for continuing to pay for school trips, including sport trips, which form such an important part of the children's educational experiences but which cannot be funded by school. Each class will enjoy and learn from a trip to the theatre at Christmas and a second main trip as well as sport's trips. Letters and details of payment will be shared nearer to the time, but if you would like to set up regular payments in advance to manage the cost, please speak to the school office.

#### **Malvern and Bellboating adventure**

The Year 4s are enjoying their super trip to Malvern, showing their developing resilience, teamwork and spirit. These aspects of learning behaviours have been developed during their time with us and we hope that they continue to flourish at their new schools. The children also thoroughly enjoyed bellboating during this term. Thank you very much to the teaching staff who gave up their time to enable the Year 4s to have such a wonderful end to their time at BFS.

## School budgets

School budgets have unfortunately not kept pace with the costs of staff, services and resources, hence the increasing reliance on the PFTA and donations. Several members of staff are working for other schools/ organisations which Blackwell benefits from by charging for our services. A separate financial newsletter will outline the school's finances, explaining that in order to keep offering the excellent education, we are relying on external funding. Thank you for your support. Our recent 'Fun Run' raised £1413.00 with Purple Class raising the most, closely followed by Blue Class. The 'Rags to Riches' raised £171.60. Thank you so much!
