Blackwell pets...

For those who were not at BFS when Hetty arrived, she is our school dog! She is looked after by one of our PFTA members during evenings, weekends and holidays and visits school each day. Most of her day will be spent resting but she will 'work' during Collective Worship and support some of our children during the day. She is named after the first girl listed on Blackwell's admission book from 1911.

We also enjoy our Guinea Pigs and the Year 2s in particular take on the responsibility of caring for them each day. Miss Kuriger supervises and takes them home at weekends and in holidays. We also have our chickens thanks to support from the PFTA. We are always looking for some experts who may be able to help us care for them and organise a rota for holiday care. The benefit of having a school dog has been documented and supports children with both mental health and life skills. Hetty is fully trained and passed a 'test' before being able to come to school.

'Animals are used to help humans in different ways. Studies suggest that the effects of pet ownership can be beneficial to physical, social and psychological wellbeing. Research has found that stroking a pet can be relaxing and can result in a reduction in blood pressure. The presence of pets can also promote social interaction and reduce psychological responses to anxiety' Hall & Malpus (2000)

Academy conversion

On June 1st, Blackwell First School became a founding member of the Worcestershire Hills Trust. For all of us so far, the most visible change has been regarding paying for invoices! The trust is dedicated to 'growing stronger together' and there has been a significant amount of work behind the scenes ensuring that the transition is smooth and that the day to day work of the school continues.

For the school moving forwards, we will be supported by a small network of other schools, working together and sharing some of the more bureaucratic burdens of school life. Working together to ensure that the children have the best possible educational experience will be our aim as a trust.

We look forward to sharing future liaison work with the trust over the coming months.

Learning during the last half term

As the children move into the last half term of the year, teachers will be working to ensure that the children make as much progress as possible in order to help them transition well into their new year groups.

Supporting them with reading, times tables (Y2-4), completing homework and talking to them about school will help them to engage with school and appreciate the value of education.

During the introduction to their 'Victorians' topic on Monday, they learned about Abraham Follett Ostler, who lived in Burcot Grange, John Cadbury, who lived in Lickey and Mary MacArthur, who helped to establish equal pay for female chain makers of Cradley Heath. The children learned about the Industrial Revolution and the role of wealthy industrialists as well as the impact of class inequality during this time, including child labour and a lack of education. Hopefully, this will help them to appreciate how lucky they are not to have been born into child labour during the Victorian era.

This topic will help children to gain a sense of History beyond living memory and make comparisons between other historical periods learned about this year. They will place Victorians chronologically onto a timeline and develop their chronological understanding. As part of this exciting topic, they will all visit a living museum (letters to follow).

Later this half term, Science will be the focus during a topic on 'Food and Farming' and teachers will share more specific details about learning this half term in their class newsletters. These newsletters share the class learning with you all along with the homework sheets.

We hope that you all enjoy the last half term in school before the summer break.

Collective Worship

In current times, it is more important than ever that we support the children in becoming responsible citizens in a changing world. This week our theme has been 'Patience' and we will consider why this is an important value and how famous people in history have shown patience and its value, for example Marie Curie, Nelson Mandela, Shakespeare.

It is important for us to support the children in understanding and valuing differences in our society and helping them play their part in living as part of our British culture with shared values that underpin a successful nation. Community is important for people's mental well-being and supporting their community will form part of work this half term.
