
# **NEWSLETTER** for Blackwell First School - Purple Class

## TOPIC

During our first topic, we are going to have a special visit from the CBSO string orchestra and use an App called Garage Band to compose music using technology. We will create music to match imaginary fantasy lands. As a school, we are also introducing Kodaly as a new method of singing which combines notes and hand gestures to help children with pitching. It is a steep learning curve for staff. Watch this space!



Art and DT are the focus subjects for our Fantasy Lands topic. We will be developing our collage techniques in art to form a final piece which can be purchased at the Summer Fayre. In DT, it is the cooking and nutrition unit we have to look forward to. Children will be tasting, designing, and making their own individual salad cup which will be their snack as we explore the artwork on display from all classes at our Fantasy Land Art gallery. (This is a child event but we are crossing all our fingers that we can get you into school very soon.)

For our jungle topic we will have an Art and Geography focus as well as transition being our main PSHE focus as we prepare children for Key Stage 2.




We have been overwhelmed by the response from the Dream **Big Foundation** following our fundraising. Look here at their messages...

### ENGLISH

All of our English learning will be focused on the story 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne during our first topic. We will learn to retell the story and innovate it to make it our own. In the story, the tunnel takes the children to a woodland, but I wonder where Purple Class's imaginations will take them? Our writing focus will be using correct punctuation and making our writing interest the reader through interesting vocabulary which is a whole school focus.

NEW

Phonics continues daily with a focus on using different spelling patterns such as suffixes (a part at the end of the word which changes its meaning) such as ful, less and ly e.g. beautiful,

quickly, hopeless. Our handwriting focus is on writing letters of a consistent size and the correct size in relation to each other i.e. tall letters such as I,h,b are taller than letters such as a and e. During our jungle topic we will use the book The Great Kapok Tree as our inspiration.
