Write Dance in Red Class...

Welcome back! I hope you're feeling rested and ready for our next topic, 'Traditional Tales', where we'll be learning to retell the story of 'The Gingerbread Man'. We will share our learning with our Nursery friends through a practical workshop including storytelling and games.

BITS AND PIECES

FOREST SCHOOL

READING

Mrs Thomas has worked at Blackwell First School for several years in our Nursery. She is currently training to teach in Red Class. This half term, Mrs Thomas will deliver some whole class lessons alongside myself.

TRADITIONAL TALES

Communication and Language/Literacy

- *Take turns to speak and listen.
- *Speak in full sentences.
- *Listen to and retell 'The Gingerbread Man'.
- *Learn new phoneme/grapheme correspondences e.g. j, v, w, x and y.
- *Continue to blend and segment CVC words i.e. jam, wet.
- *Read phrases and simple sentences.

Mathematics

- *Continue to develop basic counting skills.
- * Continue to develop number sense by using concrete apparatus.
- *Use concrete apparatus to add and subtract and develop associated vocabulary.
- *Use bar modelling to support problem solving.

Physical Development

- *Copy, create and refine motifs in dance.
- *Develop fine motor control through our music, movement and mark making sessions (Write Dance and Dough Dance).
- *Develop an efficient tripod grip and write first names using cursive script.
- *Wake and Shake- S Club 7 Don't Stop Movin'

Topic

- * Keep the beat and tap a simple rhythm.
- *Continue to use handshapes to match pitch through our Kodaly approach to singing.
- *Create prints using junk modelling.
- *Create patterns using prints and investigate monoprinting.
- *Identify some hot and cold places around the world.
- *Identify and classify animals living in hot and cold areas.
- *Ask and answer questions about a place.
