Stone age homes

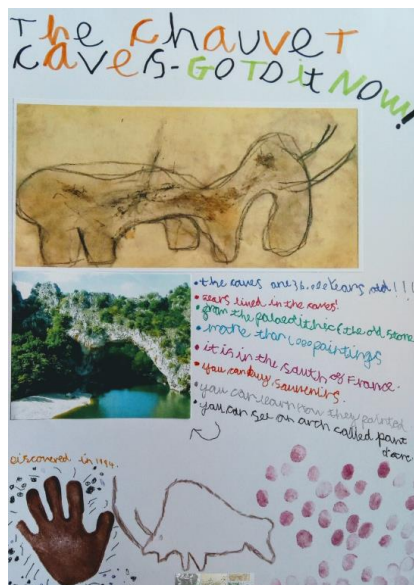


Stone age homes were very strong and a lot of them still survive today.
